#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Students received their written progress reports yesterday, Monday 1<sup>st</sup> July. I was delighted to read every report and congratulate the students on their continued dedication to their learning. Parent interviews will be held in the library on Wednesday after school, your child's teacher has sent home a note detailing your allocated time. Please contact your child's teacher if you are unable to attend so another appointment can be rescheduled at a later date.

NAIDOC Week is held from 7-14 July. The theme for this year is – Voice. Treaty. Truth. Let's work together for a shared future. NAIDOC week is a chance to acknowledge Aboriginal history, culture and achievements. We will celebrating NAIDOC day when we return next term.

**All students** will be participating in the Footsteps Dance Program during Week 2 Term 3. This is a compulsory school activity. The students will be attending daily sessions of 45 minutes, starting Monday 29 July to Friday 2 August. The three session groups will be Years K-2, Years 3-4 and Years 5-6. There will be a disco in the school hall, after school on Thursday 1 August for Kindergarten to Year 2 from 5-6pm and Years 3-6 from 6-7pm, for students to try out their new dance moves.

Today our Stage 2 and 3 students attended Wagga Wagga High School's Dance Spectacular. The students had a wonderful time and I've had feedback on their beautiful manners and excellent behaviour.

During the second week of the school holidays our school hall is going to be used by the *The Inaugural 2019 Junior Miss Wagga Wagga Program*. The 3-day program will incorporate a series of engaging workshops run by local talent to cover healthy mind and body, charity fundraising, team working, public speaking and fashion fun/dress sense, networking and interviewing practice, affording young girls a head start in becoming future leaders of our community. The program is aimed at girls between the ages of 10 and 12. We welcome the program to North Wagga Public School.

Great results were had last week at the Todd Woodbridge Cup with North Wagga winning Division 1 and 2! What an outstanding result. The student's behaviour and sportsmanship was commendable and a big thank you to Mrs Johnson for organising this event for the students.

I would like to thank Mrs Walker for increasing her days to a full time teaching load after Mrs Diaz left at the start of this term, this certainly assisted Orange class with this transition. However, due to family commitments Mrs Walker has decided to go back to 3 days a week. I am very happy to inform the school community that Ms Anna Markham will job share with Mrs Walker on Orange class for the remainder of the year. Ms Markham is coming from Lake Albert Public School with a great deal of experience. The students will meet her on Thursday. I would like to welcome her to North Wagga Public School and I know she will love getting to know our students, staff and school community.

#### PUMPKIN SOUP IN ORANGE CLASS

On the 27<sup>th</sup> of June 5/6 Orange made pumpkin soup and garlic bread. We used the pumpkins from the school garden. We had to follow a recipe in groups of 4. One group were assigned to making garlic bread. Mrs Walker brought in extra ingredients if we wanted to add them to our recipe such as: mixed herbs, parsley, cream, cumin, nutmeg, ground coriander.

This was the method the groups had to follow:

- Step 1. Cut onion and garlic and saute them in a slow cooker with butter.
- Step 2. Add water, stock cubes, baked pumpkin and cut up carrot, potatoes and other chosen ingredients.
- Step 3. Stir slowly and put on the slow cooker lid. Cook for 2hrs or until vegetables are very soft.
- Step 4. Blend with a stick blender and add cream or extra herbs if desired.

Step 5. Enjoy!


#### TABLET ROBOTICS
